

# Blanco gives grant funds to Burleigh

Tuesday wasn't your average day for three local business owners. Not only did Gov Kathleen Blanco show up on their doorsteps, but she came bearing gifts -- grant checks from the Louisiana Recovery Authority's Louisiana Business Recovery Grant and Loan Program.

The \$138 million federally funded program was designed to help small Louisiana firms with severe revenue losses get back on their feet.

More than 6,000 smallbusiness owners applied for grants, and Kirk Burleigh, owner of Cameron Fire and owner of Cameron Fire and Safety Equipment; Ernest Willis, owner of R & Y Washaterias in Lake Charles; and Susan Dunn Carraher, owner of Ad Solutions in Lake Charles, were three recipi-

Kirk Burleigh's father, Ray, started Cameron Fire and Safety Equipment in Cameron Parish in 1960.

He died 2 1/2 years ago, so he wasn't here to see his more than 40 years of hard work and dedication get washed away with Hurricane Rita's storm surge.

"It was a pile of rubble," said Kirk, who now runs the business. "There was nothing

But thanks to the \$20,000 grant check Burleigh received from Blanco, he will be able to keep his business going. "This was my dad's dream," he said. 'we're keeping his dream

Burleigh told Blanco that the application process for most of the grants out there is like "trying to eat tomato soup with a fork."

"There is always a brick wall that you hit -- always some loophole," he said.

But the Business Recovery Grant is different.

"People can actually get this grant and use it to get back on their feet," Burleigh said. "It's like you're giving us a ladle for our tomato soup. It's a blessing. This helps people realize that there really is hope out there."

With this money Burleigh plans to restock supplies and buy new equipment.

# Beach monitoring to be resumed

Beach monitoring for bacterial contamination will be back in place this summer, after being cancelled in 2005 due to hurricanes Katrina and Rita. Bruce Champion, who administers the program for the Department of Health and Hospitals, asked the Cameron Parish Police Jury Monday night to agree to partner with DHH in the effort.

As a result of the Beaches Act of 1997, he said, the Environmental Protection Agency requires each coastal state to monitor its coastal waters. The EPA set bacterial limits, and provided grant funds to operate the program. The parish's part will be to open and close the warning signs at monitoring sites whenever testing shows an elevated bacterial count.

The Beach Monitoring Program only issues advisories; it does not close beaches. Swimming is still optional, Champion said. Coastal waters will be sampled weekly beginning in May. Any site showing an elevated count will be sampled again during the same week. If the results are confirmed, an advisory will be issued and the signs will be opened until further testing shows a safe level.

Juror Steve Trahan said "It is our responsibility to protect our citizens," as the jury voted to participate in the program.

In an effort to help provide services for the tourists who are already returning to Holly

Beach, the Jury voted to amend the Temporary Food Services ordinance to allow for food services to be housed in a road ready vehicle, sited on private property only. The exception will only last one year. Juror Sonny McGee asked for the measure, saying that Holly Beach is only now beginning to rebuild, and needs more time to develop permanent business buildings. The request was prompted by Gloria Constance, whose restaurant was destroyed by Rita, and who says she wants to be able to move her business out in case of another

The debris still evident in the Holly Beach area was largely the cause of the Jury's refusal to sign off on the Corps of Engineers cleanup mission. Even though OEP Director Clifton Hebert explained that the part of the cleanup for which the Corps was responsible ended months ago, jurors were not satisfied, and requested a meeting with FEMA and the Corps before signing off.

In a related matter, Hebert reported that the state Department of Transportation and Development will be making another pass to pick up remaining debris on state rights of way. However, he stressed that the state already knows which piles of debris are left over from earlier passes. Residents should not try to add new debris, as it will not be picked up.

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
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

Jamie Arceneaux served as best man, and Colby Dufrene served as ring bearer.

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





Hebert said it will soon become necessary for the parish to take action on new debris piles on roadsides.

A request by the Department of Natural Resources to install sheet pilings to plug breaks in the levees surrounding the Cameron Creole Watershed was denied, at the request of Gravity Drainage Boards #3 and #4. Scott Henry, speaking for the District #3 board, said the breaks were caused by flood waters breaking through the shell plugs placed at the mouths of various bayous. The bayous were plugged when water control structures were first installed.

Henry said the breaks allowed flood water to flow out of the marshes much faster than they could have done through the weirs, which he said were half closed. He said sheet pilings would not have broken, and the water would have stayed much longer. He said the drainage boards would rather see the levees restored to their original height and

width before the bayous are plugged up again.

The permit was requested by DNR to help the Sabine and Cameron Prairie Refuges manage water levels inside the levees.

A request for matching funds for a walkway at the Cameron Prairie Refuge's Pintail Wildlife Trail was tabled. Sammie Faulk presented the request from the Creole Nature Trail board. The board has already re-allocated \$300,000 in grant funds to build the first 1200 feet of walkway and is seeking up to \$126,000 for the 20% match for another grant to complete the 2500 ft. project. Cameron Parish was asked to contribute \$65,000 or any lesser amount toward the match

Jurors expressed concern about the parish's financial position. McGee said he supports tourism but could not vote to build a walkway when vital infrastructure is struggling for funding. Juror Charles Precht said he could consider allocating \$20,000 to \$40,000. Steve Trahan said maybe \$20,000. Jury President Darryl Farque asked Parish Planner Ernie Broussard to look into private danors. The issue was tabled

donors. The issue was tabled. Another proposed tourist attraction is now in jeopardy. The Sabine Causeway Bridge, which jurors voted last month to pursue as a fishing pier, may not be accepted due to a liability risk. The DOTD sent a letter outlining the terms of the donation of the structure which included the parish taking liability for any damage the old bridge might cause to the new bridge in event of a future hurricane. Jurors said the parish cannot assume that liability, and voted to notify the DOTD of their position.

#### OTHER BUSINESS

Road abandonments continued Monday night as jurors voted to give Parish Road #238 in East Creole and Girard Lane in Big Lake back to the original owners. However, objections prevented the abandonment of Parish Roads #375 and #376 in East Creole and #348 in West Creole. Intention to abandon Parish Road #201 in East Creole was announced.

The Jury accepted as substantially complete the restoration of the Cameron Health Unit and the parishwide road signing projects. Health Unit staff is ready to move back into their building this week.

The jury president was given authority to sign a roofing contract for the Grand Lake Fireman's Center, and a project under-run of \$22,310 for the Johnson Bayou Maintenance Barn was accepted.

The Jury voted to advertise for bids on construction of the Cameron Fire Station, which will be built in the same location as before. A bid was awarded for the modification of the courthouse for elevator installation - \$248,000 Charles Construction. Modifications are to be complete within 60 days of signing the contract. The elevator is set to arrive in days. F. Construction was awarded the bid for repairs to the Causeway Bridge Boat Launch in Johnson Bayou, for



#### **RED SNAPPER**

Recreational Red Snapper fishing begins Saturday, Apr. 21 and yes you can have four snapper, minimum 16 inches in length, but on May 2, the limit is cut in half to only two snappers.

The National Marine Fisheries Service has agreed to reduce the limits to two per day, and will expire Sept. 30, a month before red snapper season closes. So its four, then two, then four again. I think will cause headaches for the recreational angers.

Commercial fishing will b cut from 9.1 million pounds to 6.5 million pounds, but they can keep snappers 13 inches long, down from 15 inch lengths. This is all being done to try to recover the red snap-

per populations.
Captains and crewmembers will not be able to keep their limits when the cuts are in effect. Lots of charter boat owners say this will probably run them out of business as the price of fuel is up, labor is up, as well as repairs, so they can't cut prices and lots of clients won't spend the big money for only two fish. These boats can't stay parked, so some say we'll see lots of boats on the market for

The principal discharge from this proposed source is made into Lighthouse Bayou and thence to Sabine Pass, waters of the state classified for primary contact recreation, secondary contact recreation, fish and wildlife propagation, oyster propagation. Under the SIC 4925, the applicant proposes to import, store, and vaporize Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG).

During the preparation of this permit, it has been determined that the discharge will have no adverse impact on the existing uses of the receiving waterbody. As with any discharge, however, some change in existing water quality may occur.

After a wet and cold winter, gardeners are anxious to get back into their yards, and with the recent warmer temperatures, many may have started spring gardening activities already. While experienced gardeners know what to do in their landscapes when spring rolls around, they may not take care of themselves as well as they take care of their flower beds, experts say.

"I always recommend healthy gardening," said LSU AgCenter horticulturist Bob Souvestre. "Always put on sunscreen - at least an SPF of 30 and wear protective cloth-

Long sleeves and hats that cover ears, neck and forehead can protect against the sun and mosquitoes

Souvestre points out that gardening also can put a strain on your hands, back and other muscles. It can aggravate ailments such as carpel tunnel syndrome, tendonitis or arthritis.

But stretching before shoveling, weeding or other garden activities can make it easier on individuals with these ailments and help reduce the risk of injuries, he says.








#### Msgr. Greig to celebrate Holy Week liturgies

LAKE CHARLES - The Rev. Msgr. Harry D. Greig, Diocesan Administrator, will be the celebrant at Holy Week services in the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, located at the corner of Bilbo and Kirby Streets.

Today, Holy Thursday, April 5, he will celebrate the Mass of the Lord's Supper where he will emulate Jesus washing the feet of his disciples beginning at 7 p.m. On Good Friday, April 6, at 3 p.m. he will preside at the Commemoration of the Lord's Passion and the Veneration of the Cross. Good Friday is the only day of the Church's year where Mass is not celebrated.

On Saturday, Msgr. Greig will celebrate the Easter Vigil in the Cathedral beginning at 8 p.m. with the blessing of the fire, celebration of Baptism, Confirmation and the Eucharist with the Elect and candidates.

Masses in the Cathedral on Easter Sunday will be celebrated at 7:30 a.m., 9:30 a.m., and 11:15 a.m.

Earlier in the week, Bishop-elect Glen J. Provost was the homilist at the Chrism Mass at which the Most Reverend Jude Speyrer, Bishop-emeritus, was the cele-

The blessing of the Oil of the Sick and the Oil of the Catechumen along with the consecration of the Oil of Chrism took place at the Chrism Mass, one of the most solemn and significant liturgies of the Church. # "A Seed Planted" - Good Friday Message to the Diocese of Lake Charles 2007

This is my first message to you, the beloved people of the Diocese of Lake Charles. We are all aware that it is Good Friday, a day that has always been to me a moment of serene reflection on the Passion and Death of Our Lord Jesus Christ. It is a day like no other, when a pall of silence descends on routine activity to remind us that the Savior died for us. It is a day that reminds us of the existence of suffer-

We live in a world, particularly in the developed West, that has great difficulty dealing with suffering. We try to re-define, re-name, or even deny it. However, like some inevitable sunrise whose light creeps in through the drapes we have closed to hide it, suffering enters our lives and wakes us up to another reality. As one great writer once described it,

suffering is God screaming to us.
Suffering exists. I think of those who are still displaced by Hurricane Rita in our diocese. My heart goes out to them. Their homes lost, souvenirs of a lifetime gone. I think of the older gentleman in my former parish, displaced by Katrina, who, having seen his destroyed home after months of waiting, sat on the steps and died. These are our brothers and sisters, and we cannot forget them. I think of the young service men and women returning from war, some permanently disabled. They will face the future heroically as they faced the challenge of giving themselves in service to their country. Others mourn the loss of a beloved, the widows, the widowers, the children. All of these and so many more suffer

pains deep in their hearts known only to them. To them we must say, Christ also suffered, and in His suffering gave meaning to suffering.

Our Lord Jesus Christ said in the Gospel of St. John, "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit" (John 12:24). He was speaking of Himself. He was to die and His death would not be an ending. He would rise on the third day. There is no Resurrection without death. Then, we must recall, He extended the benefits of that redemption to us. "Whoever loves his life loses it, and whoever hates his life in this world will preserve it for eternal life" (John 12:25).

There are numerous ways to view suffering, and the redemptive way is to see it as an invitation. The cross is an invitation to union. We bring it our own sufferings. We join our sufferings to Christ, and when we do, a great marriage takes place, a nuptial union between Christ and His Body. With Christ's sufferings we are swept up into the reality of His redemption. If suffering is indeed God screaming to us, then the cross is truly a loud cry above a noisy world to remind us of a God who loves and redeems us.

I join in Christ's love for you. I am so blessed to be in Lake Charles and look forward to my years as your bishop. I extend to you my best wishes and blessings for a joyful celebra-

# SW Louisiana disaster response model unique

LAKE CHARLES - Grants time its own curse." more than \$3.5 million were awarded to the Diocese of Lake Charles by Catholic Charities USA to help with recovery efforts following Hurricane Rita. About \$2 million has been spent helping those people in need here in Southwest Louisiana since the storm, according to Sandy Gay, the Director of the Office of Disaster Response of the Diocese.

"Through the grants we have helped more than 3,000 people, in the areas of furniture, appliances, utilities, building supplies, and transportation," Gay said.

Recently Judith Garza, the Disaster Response Garza, who had been with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for the previous six years, who oversees and provides technical assistance throughout the United States on disasters met with Gay over several days. Garza said she came to Southwest Louisiana to, "see your relationships with other agencies throughout the community."

"I think that Catholics need to know the role Catholic Charities has played so far in this relief effort," Gay said. "Judith coming here and the promise they have made to continue to come, providing financial assistance but also helping us so that can respond to any disaster, is a tremendous plus for the Church in this area. We really couldn't have done it without Catholic Charities. We didn't have the resources or the knowledge to do it."

"Having Garza said, worked on that side of the Federal portion of it, I know very well that volunteer agencies can sometimes be overburdened with things that fall outside of their realm. I like to make sure that you are only tasked with that which is appropriate. Volunteer agencies find it hard, especially the faith-based, to say no, which is a blessing but at the same

Garza accompanied Gay to meetings with various agencies the Office of Disaster Response works with, such as the Calcasieu Unmet Needs Committee, Red Cross, Sweetlake Faith Share, a group from Cameron, the **United Methodist Committee** on Relief, agencies in Beauregard Parish and others.

The manner in which relief organizations in Southwest Louisiana have worked together is somewhat unusual in Garza's experi-

"It is reassuring to see this community's structure and the role that Catholic Charities and other faith based groups play in recovery here," she said. "I have seen in other states and cities where it is all very sectioned and segregated. Everyone wants to head up their own recovery effort, which duplicates benefits and doesn't benefit anyone. It is nice to come here and see how well Catholic Charities is participating in everything. It's reassuring."

The collegiality of those working with disaster response also makes it easier for people who have a need.

'When you have various entities and agencies working on relief - different people will ask for the same thing from an applicant," Garza continued. "The disaster victim or survivor is being asked over and over to go through the same steps and that burdens them as well and confuses them and frustrates them. It's nice to see that eliminated here.

"What they've done here is pool their services and pool their resources and it has made a nice collective bank," Garza said. "So the applicant can get assistance without feeling victimized again. It's a great service and not something we see to this degree in other places, especially considering the size of this disas-

Gay noted that the highest While in the Diocese, level of client confidentiality is maintained even with this sharing of information regarding client needs.

More than 18 months after Hurricane Rita, many people around the country and even in Louisiana have moved on and don't think about the devastation visited on this part of the state.

"I have said this many times that what is important to me is that people not forget about Rita," Garza said. "It is still the fourth largest and fourth most catastrophic (event) that we have had. I have lived and still do live in Texas, in Houston. I remember when it was coming toward Houston, my family and everything I have ever known is there, and we breathed a sigh of relief when it didn't (hit us). But, our fortune was at someone else's

expense. "The corner of the two states that were hit are very conservative, quiet, hardworking people who don't often make a big ruckus or a big to-do about things," she said. "I think it is unfortunate that the very same thing that makes them such good, hardworking, ethical people is the thing that makes them easy to overlook. They are self-sufficient and self-reliant, so it's like having a child that you never have to worry about, because they will take care of themselves. Now little brother or little sister, the one that is always in trouble, that is different. It's just not fair. Just because the people here can do for themselves, doesn't mean they should have to do it alone.

"So, personally I would like to revisit Rita and see about getting people to think about it again, because it was grossly overlooked," she said. "It is pretty much my main issue with coming down here, to help people think about it again, put it out in their consciousness again."
