He is married to the former Cantel Mayeux and they have two sons.

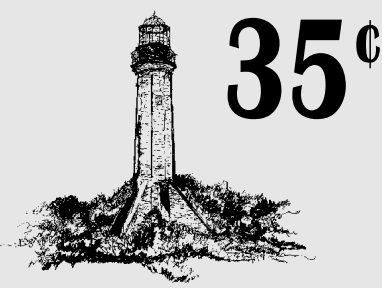

2nd LNG terminal approval expected

Cheniere Energy expects its second liquefied natural gas receiving terminal proposed for Southwest Louisiana to receive quick federal approval, a top company official said Tuesday.

Cheniere began construction in March on the first of its two Louisiana LNG terminals, an \$800 million giant in southwest Cameron Parish near Sabine Pass.

The company's Creole Trail terminal, planned for a tract along the Calcasieu River Ship Channel in Cameron Parish, is waiting on approval from the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, the federal agency that approves all onshore LNG facilities.

Keith M. Meyer, the president of Cheniere's LNG unit, said the company expects the FERC to approve the Creole Trail project by early 2006 because the design is nearly identical to the Sabine Pass terminal, and community support for the facility has been strong.

"Because of that local support we make the job of FERC

much easier, because they don't get the letters from the congressmen and the governors and the senators... about trying to stop the project," said Meyer, who spoke Tuesday at a meeting of the Lake Charles Propeller Club.

Both terminals will take three years to complete, he said. Once the two terminals are completed, Cheniere will market them as a kind of LNG import hub for the entire nation.

"We sort of look at the Creole Trail terminal and the Sabine terminal almost as one big premier North American gateway," Meyer said.

Each facility would create 70-80 permanent jobs, the company has said. But Meyer on Tuesday said the most dramatic benefit of LNG will be in job retention particularly in the local petrochemical facilities and refineries.

Local industries, which rely heavily on natural gas to operate have cut their work forces in recent years due to the spike in gas prices. Cheaper gas would likely equal more profits and more workers for area industries.

The U. S. Coast Guard and the Maritime Administration is seeking public comment on the environmental impact statement to assist in the evaluation of an application for a license for the proposed Pearl Crossing LNG liquefied natural gas deepwater port in the Gulf of Mexico off Cameron Parish.

Three public meetings will be held from 6 to 8 p.m. preceded by an open house from 4 to 5:30 p.m. as follows:

*Sulphur, Tuesday, May 3, Holiday Inn Express.

*Johnson Bayou Community Center, Wednesday, May 4 in Johnson Bayou.

*Portland, Texas, Thursday, May 5 at the Portland Recreation Dept.

Written and oral comments will be accepted at these meetings.

Alton Trahan, former board member, dies

Funeral services for Alton Alfred Trahan, 84, of Johnson Bayou, were held Sunday, April 17, in the Johnson Bayou Baptist Church with Rev. Vernon Chevalier officiating. Burial was in Head of the Hollow Cemetery under the direction of Robison Funeral Home.

Mr. Trahan died Thursday, April 14, 2005. Alton was born in Orange, Texas, and was a lifelong resident of Johnson Bayou.

Mr. Trahan attended elementary school and completed the 4th grade. A self taught man, he later went on to receive his high school diploma.

As a young man he made his living hunting and trapping. At the age of 21, he served during World War II in the Army Battalion A, 107th Field Artillery, from 1942 - 1945. He was in the Normandy Invasion on Omaha Beach and major battles in Northern France, Rhineland, Ardennes and Central Europe. He held the rank of Sgt. Tech 4. He was a member of the VFW Cameron Post.

Mr. Trahan retired from Mobil Oil Company after 40 years of service as a lease operator. He served his community for 12 years as the Johnson Bayou School Board member and was instrumental in the building of Johnson Bayou School as well as getting the High School State Accredited.

Mr. Trahan was a member of Johnson Bayou Baptist Church.

He is survived by his wife, Mae "Coochie" Trahan, two sons; Jesse Trahan and wife, Vicky, Greg Trahan and wife, Penny; two daughters; Judy Erbeling and husband Dwight and Sharon Boudreaux and husband Jay, all of Johnson Bayou; two brothers: Allen Trahan and Uty Trahan, both of Johnson Bayou; two sisters: Lorraine Blanchard of Johnson Bayou and Sylvia Constance of Sulphur; 11 grandchildren and 16 great grandchildren.

The birders are coming...

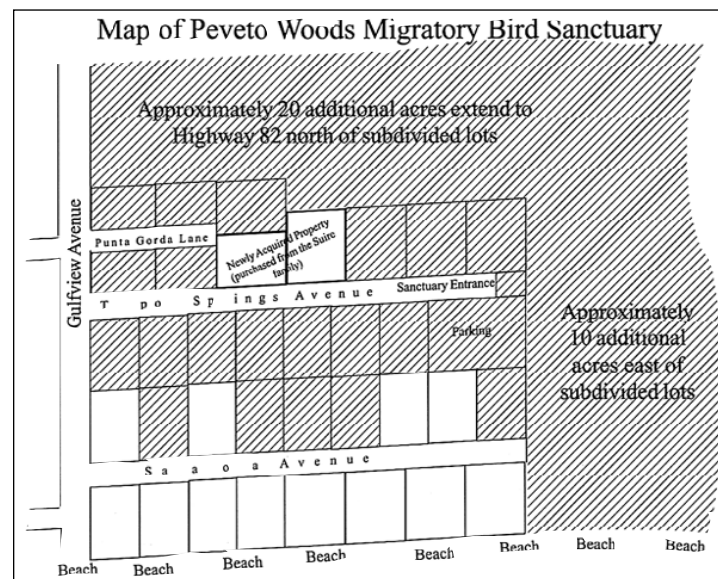

The birders are coming. What started as a trickle many years ago, and has grown to a stream, may soon become a steadily flowing river of bird and nature enthusiasts journeying to Cameron Parish to see and appreciate the bounty of birds and wildlife here.

This month's release of the "America's WETLAND Birding Trail" guide, combined with the placement in key locations of interactive electronic kiosks giving wetland information, will only boost what has become a noticeable trend.

Thanks to the Creole Nature Trail All American Road designation and publicity provided by the Southwest Louisiana Convention and Visitors Center, the nation and the world are getting to know Cameron Parish.

Of course, locals and Louisiana folks have known about the abundant bird and wildlife population for years.

Bird sanctuary being expanded at J. Bayou

(EDITOR'S NOTE--The Baton Rouge Audubon Society has owned the Peveto Woods Migratory Bird Sanctuary near Johnson Bayou for some years. The following article tells about a recent expansion of the sanctuary.)

Baton Rouge Audubon Society is pleased to announce the long awaited purchase of the Suire house and property at our Peveto Woods Migratory Bird Sanctuary.

The Suire Property is 1.5 acres in size, surrounded by Sanctuary, located adjacent to the entrance, and has remained in private ownership throughout our campaign to save the Peveto Woods Chenier.

This property became available for sale in December 2004. The BRAS board considered its strategic location and exciting possibilities for the future and chose to join the birds "out on a limb" by securing a loan and purchasing the property for \$117,000.

We are asking for your financial assistance to help us

repay this loan and complete this project which will create continuity in our 45 acres of protected Sanctuary.

Twenty years ago a group of concerned citizens joined forces with BRAS to save Peveto Woods, a necessary piece of the Neotropical migrant bird habitat puzzle, from imminent development. These beautiful woods, a live oak-hackberry chenier in Cameron Parish, have been host to hundreds of thousands of birders. Our Sanctuary educates visitors on the importance of coastal cheniers as migratory bird habitat along the Gulf Coast. The word chenier means "place of oaks," so named by early French settlers for the stately live oaks that characterize these woods.

We are not alone in recognizing Peveto Woods as a vital part of the Louisiana coast. Our sanctuary is often highlighted in magazines and newspapers as a great place to bird and is listed as a stop on the new Louisiana Great Gulf Coast Birding Trail. around 125 birders for the weekend. An article in the New York Times last October continues to result in visitors from as far away as North Dakota and London, England.

The new birding guide has been in the works for over a year and is the result of extensive research and development by tourism and birding experts from around the state. The guide connects Louisiana with other state Birding Trails already designed, including Texas and Florida, to create the Great Gulf Coast Birding Trail, which will eventually include Mexico and other countries as well.

In Louisiana, as other states, the coast is divided into a series of "loops," short trips which can be taken off a main highway, in our case Interstate 10. Louisiana has 12 loops, beginning with the Sabine and Creole loops in Cameron Parish. The Lacassine Loop is also partly in Cameron Parish.

Each loop has a series of recommended stops for observing birds, with a key to the services available.

The Sabine, Rockefeller, Lacassine, and Cameron Prairie Refuge headquarters are designated America's WETLAND Resource Centers, having brochures as well as the electronic kiosks. The Louisiana Trail guide is designed to not only promote birding, a huge and growing national pastime, but to reinforce the value of Louisiana's cost as "America's Wetland." Information on Louisiana's vanishing coast and its importance to the nation is included.

Birders, from the dedicated to the casual, travel across the country to see new birds. Sometimes they are just on their way through to another business or personal destination, but will take an extra day or two for some quality bird and nature watching along the way.

Local food and lodging establishments report visitors from all over the country; recent visitors having come from Alaska, Vermont, Wisconsin, Indiana, Michigan, Mississippi, Oklahoma, Washington, New York, North Dakota, and London, England, to name a few.

Spring and fall are the primary birding seasons on the Gulf Coast, but winter is picking up, especially for northern travelers. Local businesses could take cues from other birding destinations such as High Island, Tex., and put out signs welcoming birders during peak migration season and providing a place to post recent sightings.

A good supply of film for tourists cameras could help. A frequent request is for boat tours in the lake or marshes. Anyone offering these services should contact the Cameron Parish Chamber of Commerce with their information.

Backyard bird watching can be very exciting at this time of year. The colorful spring migratory birds are arriving daily from their trip across the Gulf of Mexico and alighting in coastal trees and fence rows to rest and feed as they move north to their nesting grounds.

In one pecan tree on Tuesday were spotted Orchard Orioles, Baltimore Orioles, Summer Tanager, Blue Grosbeak, Indigo Bunting, Ruby Throated Hummingbird, Cerulean, Prothonotary, and Kentucky Warblers, along with the regular White Winged Dove, Blue Jay, Cardinal, and Boat Tailed Grackle. The day before, four Scarlet Tanagers came and went.

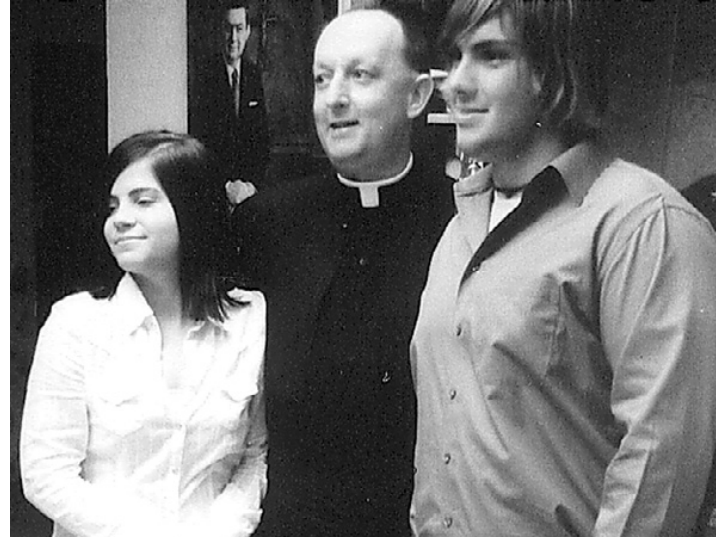
Camp Blue includes outdoor cookouts, musical entertainment, games, exercise and seminars on a variety of topics.

The cost for Camp Bluebird is \$25 per camper, however scholarships are available for those who cannot afford the registration fee.

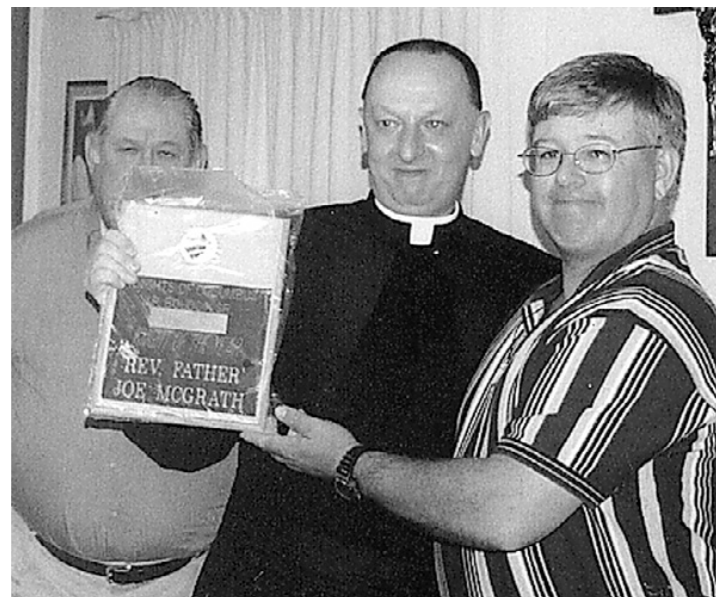
Transportation from Memorial Hospital to and from Camp Bluebird is provided by the hospital.

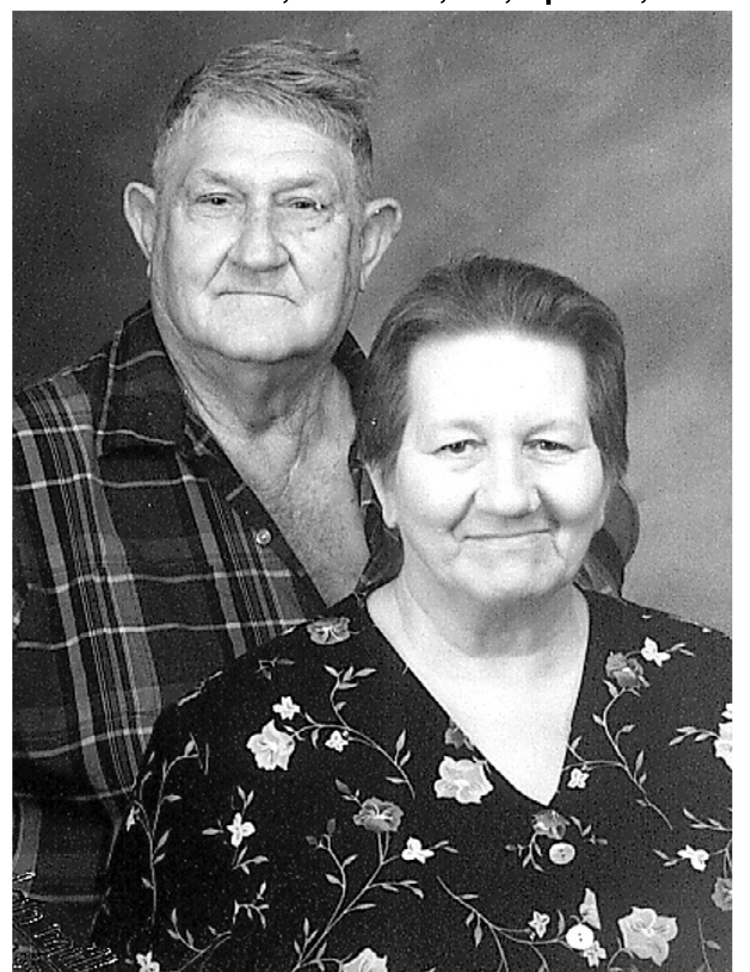

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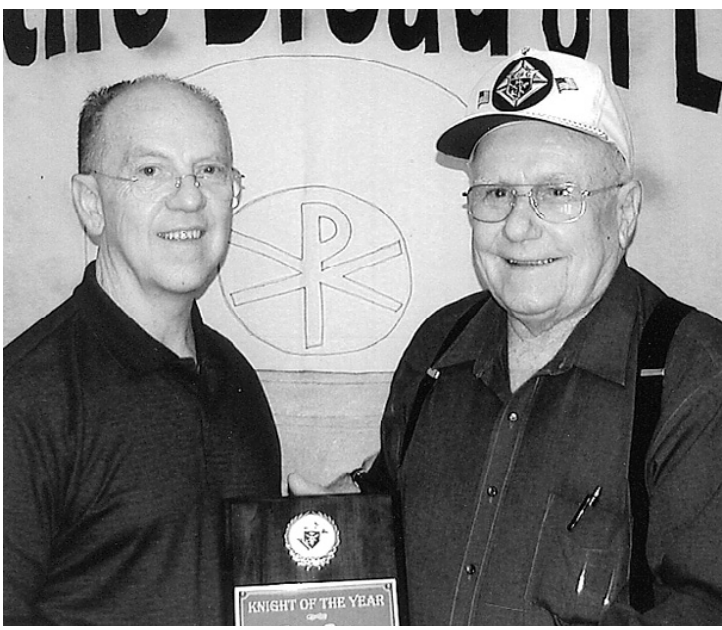
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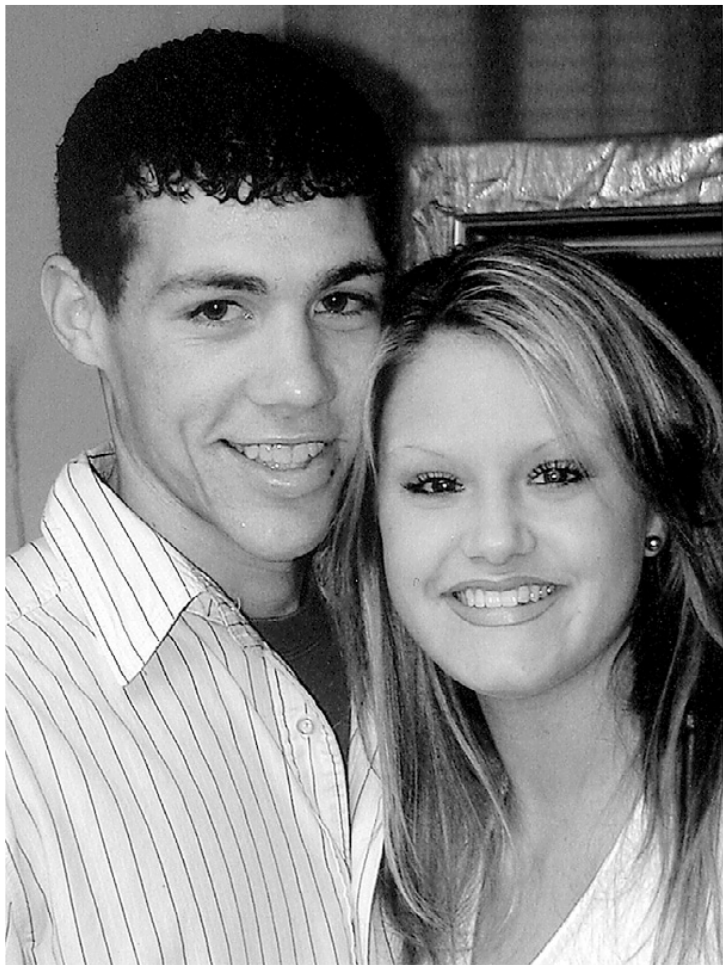

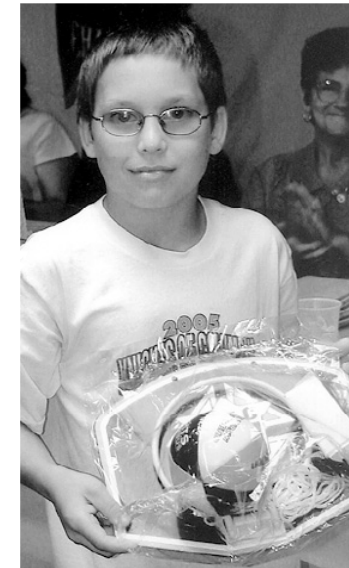

TERMINAL OPPOSITION

The Coastal Conservation Association (CCA) seems on a roll, strongly being upfront with some of their plans and feelings.

The CCA has registered strong opposition to offshore open-loop liquefied natural gas (LNG) terminals and is demanding that such terminals approved for construction by the federal government must have zero net impact on marine fishing resources, which includes redfish stocks.

The U. S. Department of Transportation issued a decision in February that will result in permitting the use of an open-loop system at Shell's Gulf Landing LNG terminal of the Cameron Parish Coast, a project of Shell US Gas & Power LLC, despite CCA's opposition.

The CCA says they didn't save redfish, so open-loop LNG plants could kill them and didn't object to a closed-loop system.

The Shell Pipeline Co. has been a long time sponsor of S.T.A.R. and other conservation items. Because of the situation regarding the LNG terminal, a joint decision was made not to include Shell Pipeline among S.T.A.R. sponsors this year and until further notice.

The CCA has also had uncomfortable issues with the Sportsman Magazine over the issue of public waters where canals led to private lands and land owners started posting these canals, where fishermen have been fishing for years. CCA didn't want to get involved because of lengthy litigation for many, many years. Courts have upheld for years the rights of property owners.

The Sportsman Magazine has published articles on this issue and the CCA expressed concerns about the direction the publication has taken towards the association, so there is no longer a partnership between the two on projects such as the S.T.A.R. tournament.

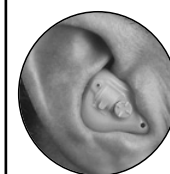

Baton Rouge--As part of the efforts to improve health outcomes for Louisiana's children, Gov. Kathleen Babineaux Blanco has declared the week of April 24 as National Infant Immunization Awareness Week in the state of Louisiana. Parish health units across the state, as well as partner clinics in some areas of the state, will be open extended hours on Monday, April 25 through Friday, April 29 to make it easier for parents to have their children immunized.
The clinic for Cameron Parish will be held at the Cameron Health Unit located behind the Cameron Courthouse. The telephone number is 775-5368.
"Through these targeted efforts, we are continuing the mission of the Shots for Tots program to have every child up to date on his or her immunizations by age one," said DHH Secretary Dr. Fred Cerise.
Parish health units will be open from 8 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, and from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday and Thursday during the week of April 24. Shots will be provided at no cost for those who are eligible for the Vaccines for Children program. This includes people receiving Medicaid, those without insurance and Native Americans.
There will be a \$10 administrative fee for all others who receive shots at parish health units, though no one will be denied immunizations due to inability to pay. Appointments are not necessary (unless otherwise noted below.) Parents should be sure to bring their child's vaccination record.
