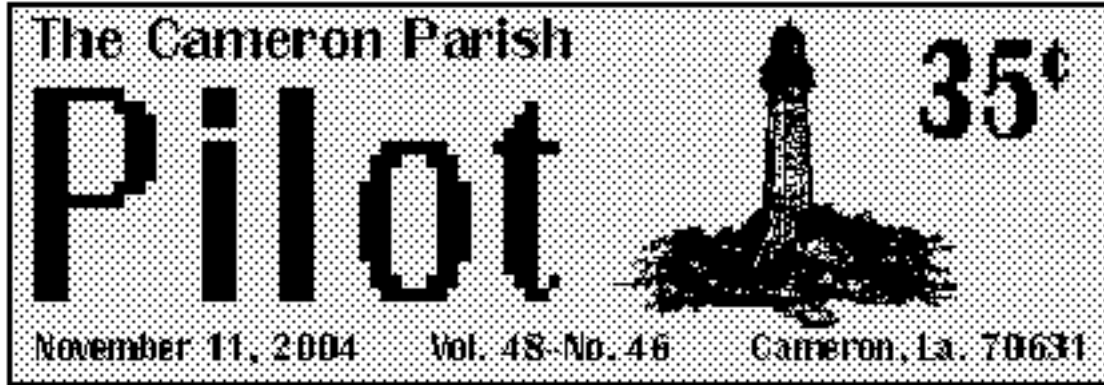

## Ellender Bridge will be closed for repairs Dec. 7-12

The Ellender Bridge over the Intracoastal Canal north of Hackberry will be closed for highway traffic beginning at 8 a.m., Tuesday, Dec. 7 through Sunday, Dec. 12, to repair damages from a barge collision.

The bridge was struck by the barge on Oct. 21 causing extensive damage. The bridge was closed for five days for emergency repairs and was reopened on Oct. 26.

The new closing is for the replacement of fender under the bridge.

Marine traffic will be limited during the repairs as the bridge cannot be opened during this period.

Pedestrian traffic will be allowed across the bridge Tuesday and Wednesday, Dec.

7 and 8.

Pedestrian traffic will NOT be allowed on Thursday, Dec. 9 through Sunday, Dec. 12.

The new closing will be a hardship on Hackberry residents going north to Sulphur or Lake Charles to work, to visit the doctor, shop etc.

The only alternate routes are over 100 miles long either through Johnson Bayou and Port Arthur or through Cameron and Creole.

During the first closure medical emergencies in Hackberry were done with patients being transported to the bridge by Cameron Ambulance District II ambulance with a transfer being made to a Cal-Cam Hospital ambulance on the north side of the bridge.

## Sempra permit again tabled by Police Jury

A controversial permit application by Cameron LNG (Sempra) of Hackberry has again been delayed by the Police Jury. At their Wednesday, Nov. 3 meeting, jurors again tabled the permit pending a report from the West Cameron Port Board.

The port board is still trying to arrange a meeting with the Lake Charles Port Board about the fees the Lake Charles authority plans to charge LNG ships docking at the facility, which is in Cameron Parish. The West Cameron Port is seeking to retain outside legal counsel.

Another controversial permit is being contested in the courts. After an executive session the Jury authorized the District Attorney to file an appeal with the 1st Circuit Court in the matter of Environmental Partners' proposed low temperature thermal desorption unit at AB Dock Services in Cameron.

The facility has received a permit from the Commissioner of Conservation. The parish filed for a judicial review of the application and permit. After oral arguments on Oct. 25 in the 19th Judicial District Court in Baton Rouge, the judge found the commissioner had acted properly in granting the permit. The parish is appealing that decision.

Environmental Partners still needs an air quality permit from the department of Environmental Quality.

## 3 parish schools honored for their academic growth

Three schools in Cameron Parish were honored by the School Board Monday for achieving academic growth and improved school performance scores for 2003-04. South Cameron Elementary and Hackberry High School received Two Star performance labels, while Grand Lake School received a Three Star Label.

South Cameron Elementary School was cited for Exemplary Academic Growth and Hackberry High School and Grand Lake School were cited for Recognized Academic Growth.

Each school showed increases in the School Performance Score (SPS). Three other schools, Cameron Elementary, South Cameron High, and Johnson Bayou showed declining scores for

the second straight year, with Cameron Elementary falling below the state average of 82.9.

## Absentee voting set here soon

Identification at the polls is not a new requirement, but because of all the many newly registered voters it's important that they be aware of this requirement.

Finally, any person who feels they need assistance in voting due to a physical disability such as poor eyesight or other must get a physicians certificate confirming the need for assistance in voting and submit it to the registrar prior to the election or give the certificate to the commissioners at the polls on election day.

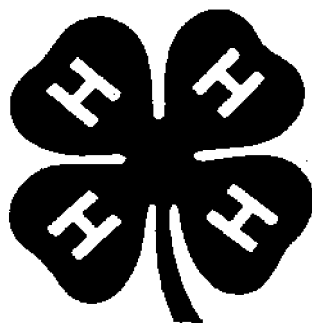

## Junior leaders to meet here on Nov. 16th

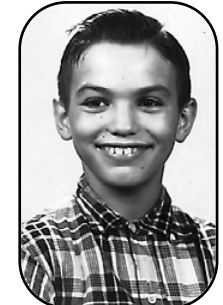

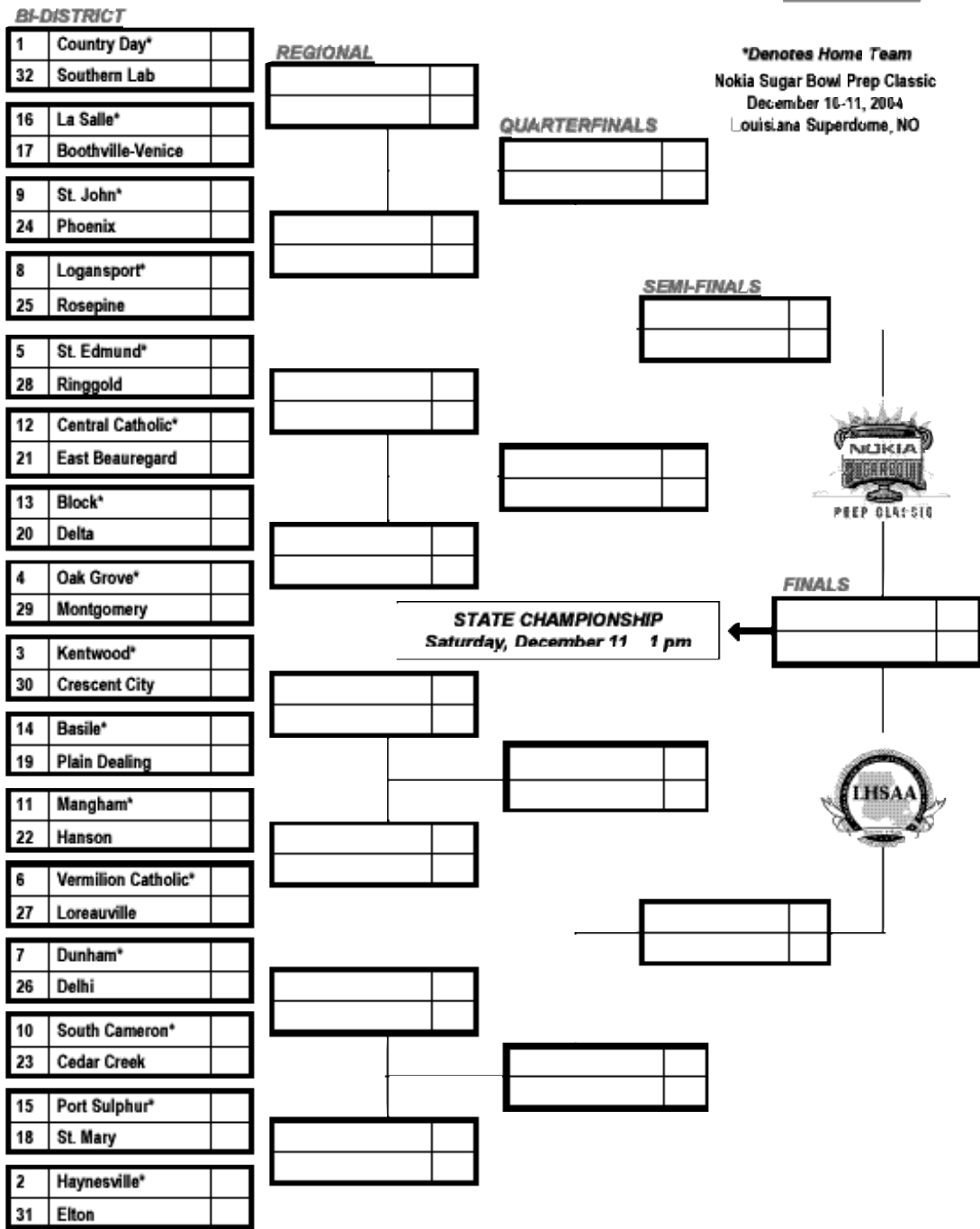

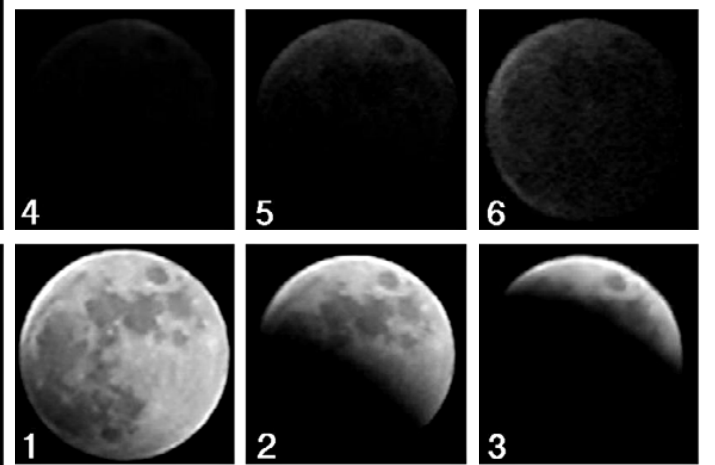

DUCK SEASON OPENS

This weekend, Saturday, Nov. 13, the duck and coot season in the west zone will open at 30 minutes before sunrise, for the 60 day season. Also the season on rails and gallinules opens the same day.

There is an important change for our 2004-05 season. Pintails and canvasbacks (1 per day) can only be taken during separate 30 day seasons.

The regular season for the west zone runs from Nov. 13 through Dec. 18 through Jan. 23 for the second split.

The pintail season for the west zone runs Nov. 13-21 and Dec. 18 - Jan. 7 (30 days), while canvasback season runs 30 days statewide Dec. 18 - Jan. 16.

The daily bag limit on ducks is six and may include no more than four mallards (no more than two of which may be females), one black duck, two wood ducks, three mottled ducks, three scaups and two redheads. During the specified 30 day seasons for pintail and canvasbacks, the daily bag limit is one. The daily bag limit on coots is fifteen.

In addition to the regular limit, there is an extra on mergansers. The daily bag limit is five, only one of which may be a hooded merganser.

Possession limits on ducks, coots and mergansers is twice the daily bag limit.

The goose season opened statewide last weekend and runs through Dec. 5 and the season split runs Dec. 18 through Feb. 11. Daily bag limit is 20. There is no possession limit for snow, blue or ross geese. White-fronted (specklebelly) geese have the same dates as the snow geese season. The daily bag limit is two and possession limit is four.

There is also a conservation order for light geese statewide, Dec. 6 - Dec. 17 and Feb. 12 - Mar. 13. Only snow, blue and ross geese may be taken under the terms of the Conservation Order, which allows the use of electronic calls, unplugged shotguns and no daily or possession limits. Shooting hours begin one half hour before sunrise to one half hour after sunset.

Canada goose season runs Jan. 15 - 23. Need a special five dollar permit and read the pamphlet to find boundaries that are open. Rail and gallinule seasons run Nov. 13 - Jan. King and clapper rails daily limits is fifteen in aggregate, possession thirty. Sara and Virginia rails daily and possession limit is twenty-five in aggregate. The limit for gallinules is fifteen daily and possession of thirty.

Any resident waterfowl hunter ages 16-59, must carry a valid La. Duck license, federal duck stamp, signed in ink across the face and a La. HIP permit, plus a basic hunting license. Residents who turn 60 after June 1, 2000, be required to have a senior hunt/fish license and a HIP permit. Any waterfowler 16 years and older must have a federal duck stamp.

No person shall give, put or leave any migratory game

birds at any place or in the custody of another person unless the birds are tagged by the hunter with the following information: The hunter's signature, hunter's address, the total number of birds involved, by species and the date such birds were killed. I always put my hunting license number also or if you are exempt because of age, then put your HIP ID number or driver's license number.

Remember do not completely field dress your birds. Leave the head and one fully feathered wing attached, where ever you are transporting migratory birds.

WHERE'S "D" DUCKS

Most hunters are asking where's the ducks? Well, in some marshes, there are a few ducks, but in lots of marshes there's little if any ducks at all. Unless we see more ducks moving into our area, I think this could be the worst opening in a few years.

I do know that there's lots of saltwater in our marshes. The front marsh I hunt in Grand Chenier, has saltwater to the road, so salty it tastes like the Gulf water.

I have also went into the Little Chenier-Chenier Perdue marsh, and I didn't see many ducks there either. I understand the Big Burn has a few ducks closer to the highway going to Creole-Gibbstown, but deeper into the marsh going east there are no ducks either.

Tarpons host Cougars in playoff game Friday

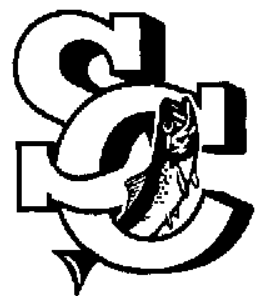

Both of South Cameron's runningbacks had 100 yards night games. Dominique LeBlanc had three touchdown runs of 59, 30, and six yards to go with his 189 yards on 13 carries. Matt Styron added TD runs of one and two yards enroute to 128 yards on 24 carries.

Deil Lalande scored first for the Tarpons on a 15 yard run. Lalande ended the night with 30 yards on four carries. William Mallett was five of six on extra points in the contest. Quarterback Andre Savoie completed four of four passes for 67 yards.

The Tarpons finish the regular season at 8-2 and 4-2 in district. They finished tied for second in district 5-1A with East Beauregard and Basile behind champions St. Edmund Bluejays.

  - 1/4 tsp. chili powder
  - 1 tsp. soy sauce
  - 1/2 tsp. hot sauce
- Chop the shrimp into very fine pieces. Combine all of the ingredients and blend well. Chill overnight to allow flavors to blend. Makes 2 cups.
