LIBRARY CLUB

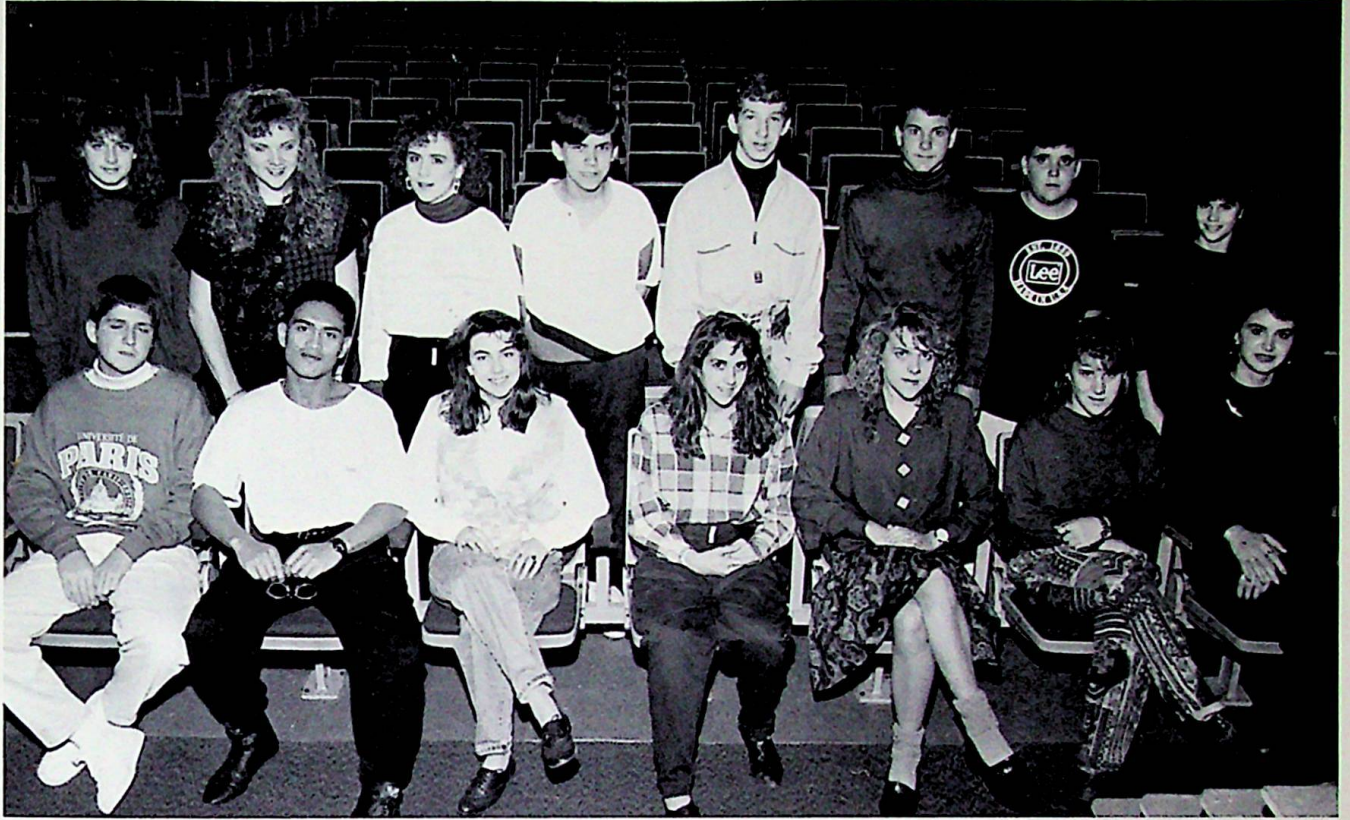
The membership in the Library Club is composed of high school students who are interested in library work.
