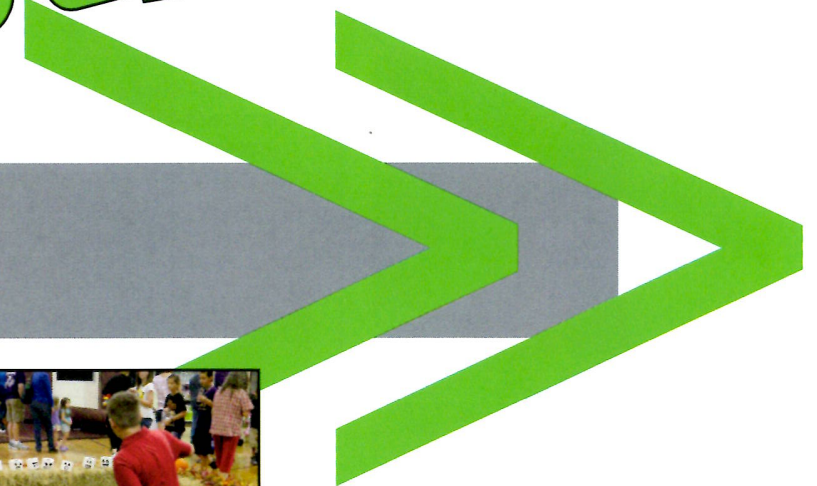

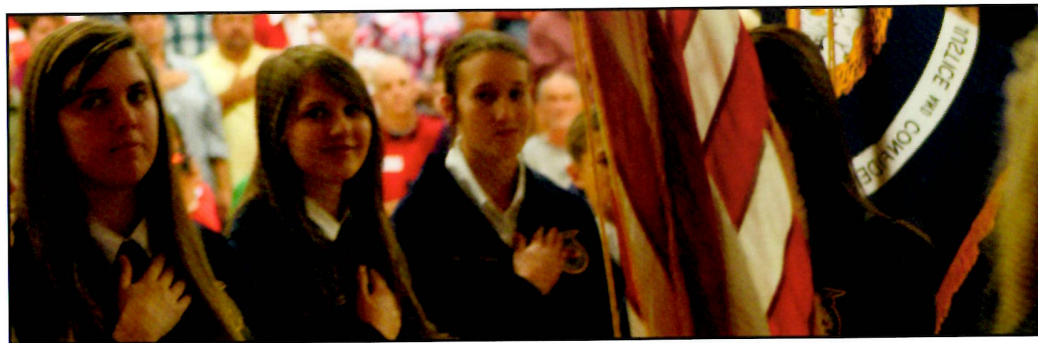

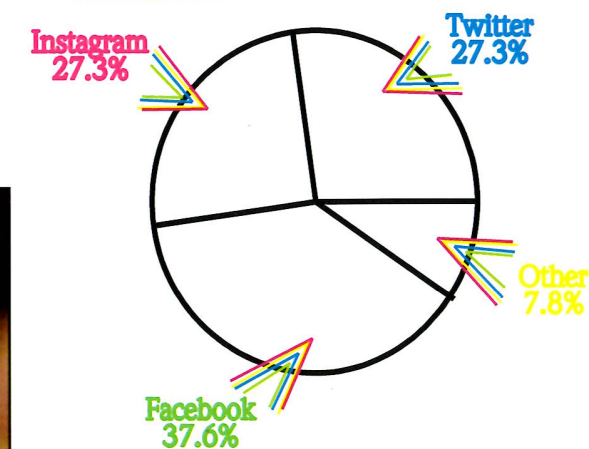

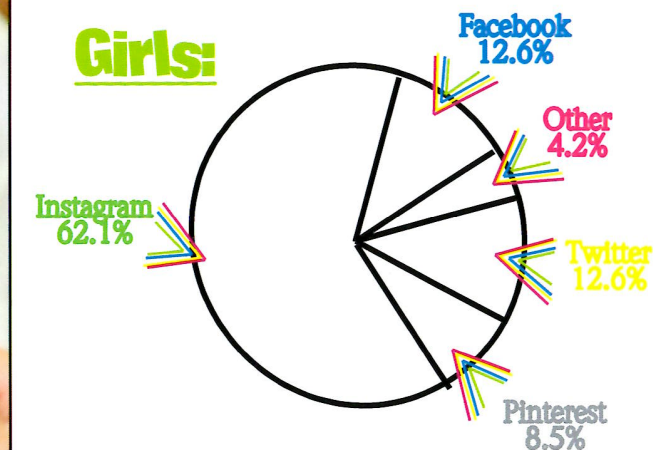

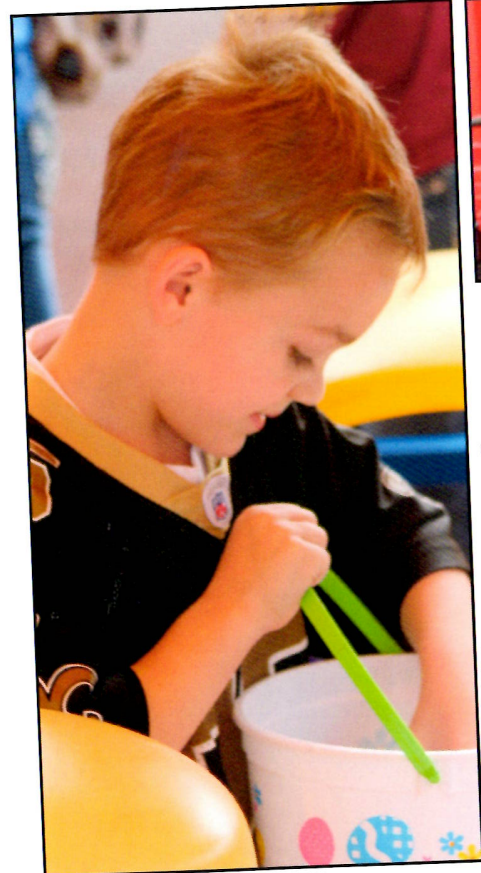

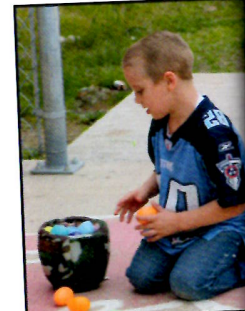


Golden Eggs

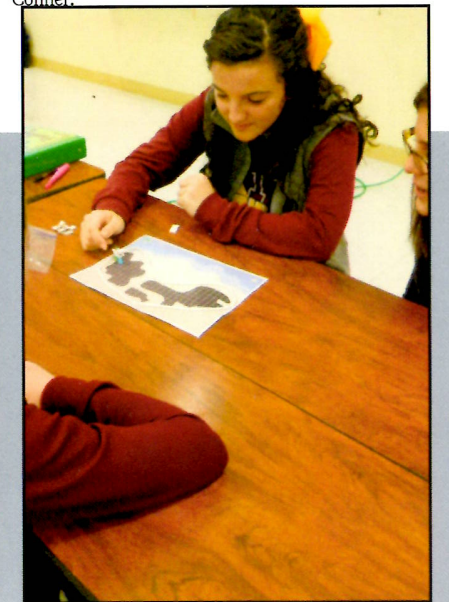

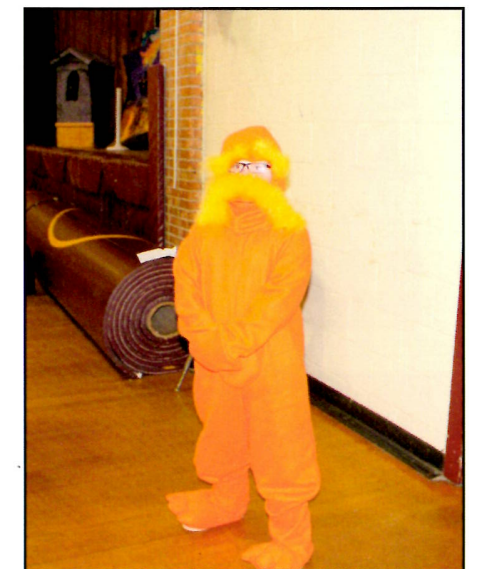

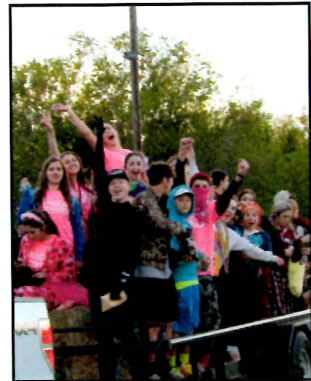

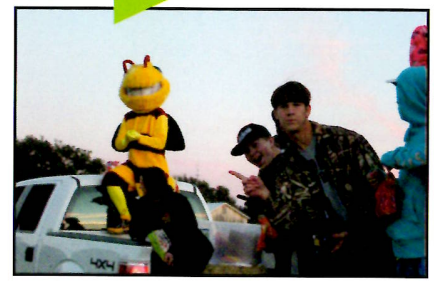

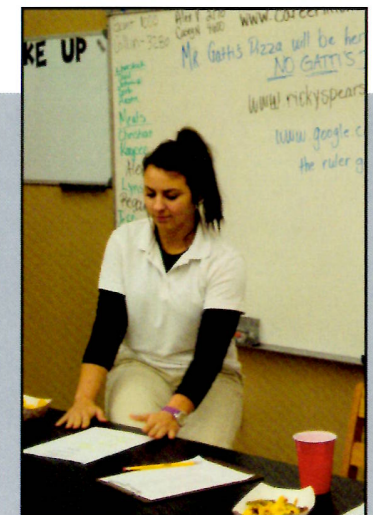

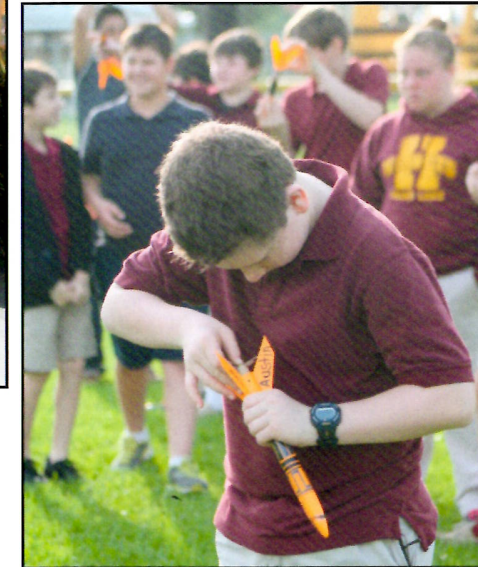

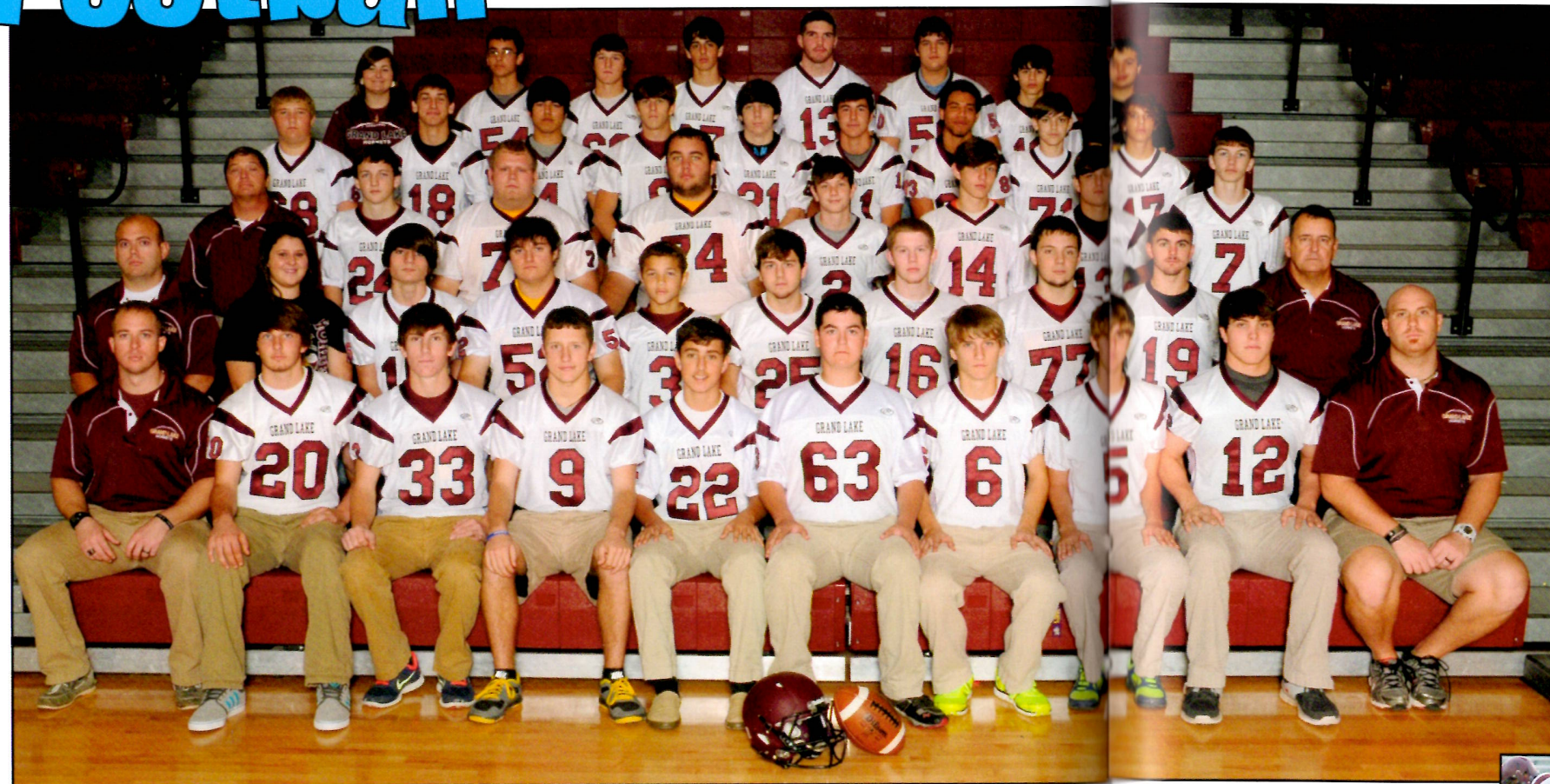

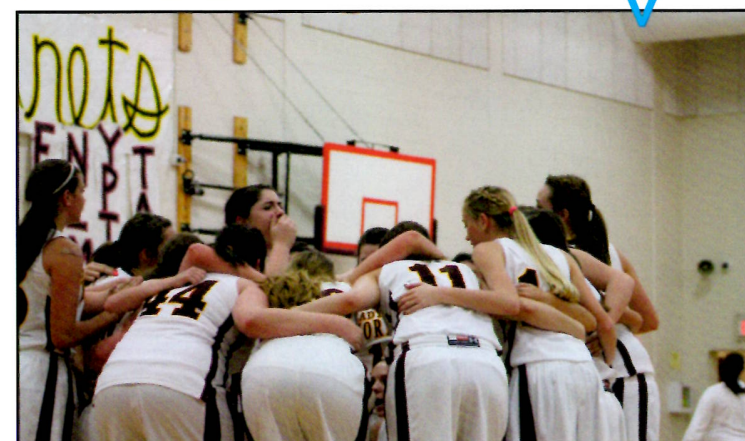

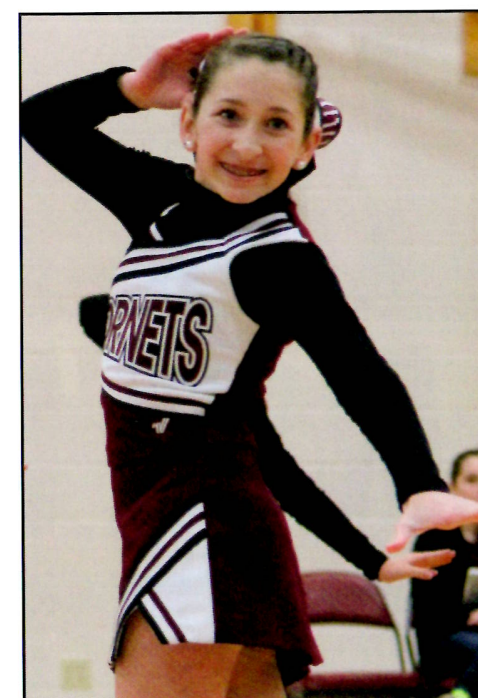

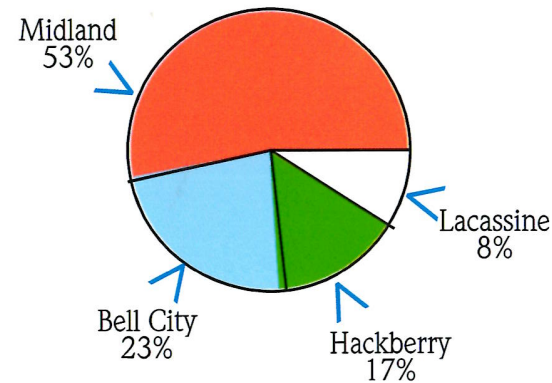

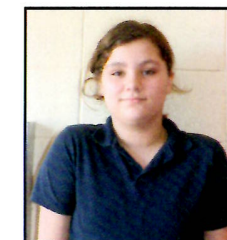
