
















- 6) Students and teachers formed a ciricle and have a dance off. Mrs. Missy Poole showed off her moves in the middle of the circle while students cheered her on.

4) The varsity baseball team and softball team were both awarded trophies as District Champions. Both teams went undefeated in








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A: Science is my favorite subject. I plan on becoming a veterinarian. As I learn more about animals my desire to work in the field of science continues to grow.






