
All in a School Day






2) Wednesday was color day, Lynsey Mhire(12) and Erica Williams(12) show their originality on color day by dressing up as a pilgrim and a mime.







Q: What is your dream Job?


A: My dream Job is to work behind the scenes of Saturday Night Live and help make the show happen.











Small Town, Big Dream


Mr. Mike Thomas
