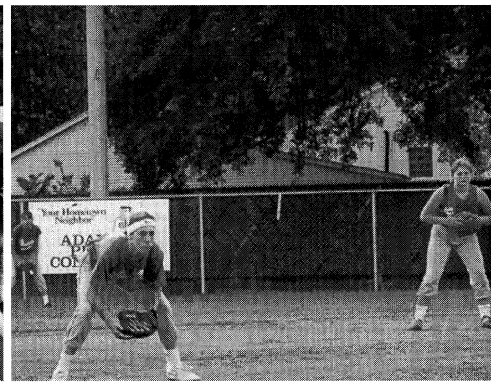

The Hackberry High School seal is very unique. Each part symbolizes something special. The horses are Mustangs — the school mascot. The alligator and ducks represent abundant wildlife. The oil derrick signifies oil in the area. Crabs and shrimp pertain to the seafood livelihood of many residents. The Louisiana map features a star indicating the town's location. The cow head symbolizes the cattle industry. The open book and winged foot signify academics and athletics. The ribbon displays the founding year of the school. The Hackberry leaves symbolize the community's name. Each branch has six berries. The two branches hold twelve berries which represent the twelve grades of education.

A YEAR OF CHANGES



1871-1996

This year marks the 125th anniversary of Hackberry High School. Through the years, many changes have occurred. The original school term lasted three months with lessons in reading, writing, arithmetic, and spelling only. By 1896, the school term reached nine months.

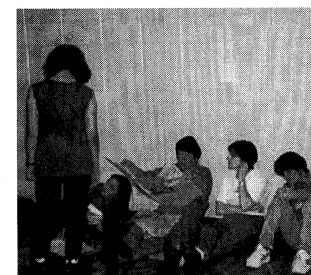
In the late 1920's, the high school began. The school held its first graduation for four students in 1932. The addition of the high school brought new curricula and clubs, such as the Corn Club, Pig Club, and Sewing Club.

In the 1940's the lunch program began. The table scraps were fed to penned pigs behind the school. Before the end of the school term, the pigs were slaughtered and used in the lunch program.

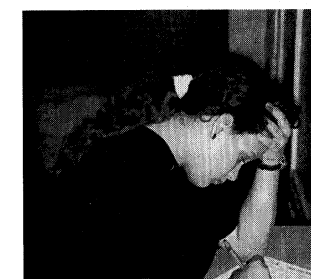
Over the last fifty years, Hackberry High has continued to grow to keep pace with the changing technology of modern society.

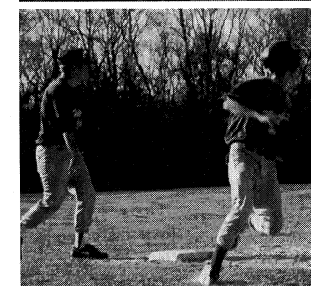
