He and Pat Roberts operate the Mammoth Bakery on main street in Cameron. They each share their work. Ronnie does the labor and Pat does the sampling.


Leland Rutherford just loved his old Alma Mater so much, he could not make up his mind to leave. He has replaced Leland Crochet as janitor.

Leo Domingue wills his charm and personality to Robert Richard.





Horace Mhire wills his track shoes to Pat Pinch so that one day he may become as fast as Horace and break a world record.




FOREWORD
